## Grangetown Primary Sports Premium Funding 2020 - 21 Statement

### What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing funding of £150 million per annum to provide new and substantial primary school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school Head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

#### Purpose of the funding

All schools have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but there is freedom to choose how we do it. At Grangetown Primary School we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. In addition, we believe that an innovative and varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all children.

#### COVID 19

The onset of COVID and the resulting lockdowns have had a huge impact on school sports and how they have been delivered. During lockdown all external school sports were stopped and they have not started again since March. We are currently coming to an end of our present lockdown and going into a new Tier system. School sports will continue to be postponed for the near future. The School Sports Partnership are constantly reviewing guidance and hope to get things started as soon as possible. The costs have not changed we still need to pay the money to be part of the SSP and part pay for our sports coach.
