


HALF TERMLY NEWSLETTER

INTRODUCTION

In September 2024, Lauren joined us as a Family Support Worker. She works across the Trust and is with us in Grangetown on Wednesday's.

The role of the family support worker is to offer support to the whole family at the earliest opportunity. It is about helping families to face problems and get the right support at the right time. Early help is not one size fits all. Where one family may be struggling with implementing routines, another may be having difficulties with family dynamics.

We understand that life comes in all shapes and sizes, and the way in which this can impact our young people can leave them feeling big emotions that they may not understand. There may have been a recent change in the families' circumstances, there may be issues with poverty or struggles around special educational needs. The scale of support that can be offered is diverse and varies family to family. The role of the Family Support Worker is to tailor support to each family to create a Family Plan which will look at set outcomes and achievements for the family, and together we will work towards that goal.

Early help is a proactive approach, rather than a reactive one. Let's try and get in early before issues escalate and offer the best opportunities for our children, young people and families.
